Dear Families,

As we approach the end of the academic year, we would like to express our gratitude to each one of you for your invaluable support and engagement with our first ever transition process at Dixons Newall Green Academy. It has been an incredible journey so far, and we are excited to continue working with you.

We are pleased to announce that the very first Year 7 (Class of 2028) students will be returning on Wednesday, 6 September 2023, marking the beginning of their induction process. It is an important day for our new students, and we kindly request that they arrive promptly at 8am. Upon arrival, they will be directed to their designated Morning Meeting location for their very first lesson.

I would like to update families regarding our readiness to open. As you may have seen, work on our temporary building is now underway and will continue through July and August. We are currently awaiting 'sign-off' from the Secretary of State for Education, therefore all offers of a place at our academy from the Local Authority remain conditional at this point, as explained in your offer letters. We are, however, on track for a smooth handover and start to the academic year.

We would like to invite parents to a special drop-in event on Friday, 8 September 2023, at 2:30pm. This gathering provides a fantastic opportunity for you to join us, have a cup of tea, and explore our new temporary school building. We believe that seeing the physical space where your child will be learning is an essential part of fostering a strong partnership between home and school. Additionally, this event serves as a chance to meet your child's advisor, who will be your primary point of contact throughout the year. They will play a crucial role in supporting your child's academic and personal development.

Furthermore, we want to assure you that your child's academic progress will continue to be a priority at Dixons Newall Green Academy. We are committed to keeping you informed about your child's achievements and areas for growth. Parent-teacher meetings will be scheduled during designated parents' evenings, providing an opportunity for meaningful conversations about your child's progress. Additionally, we will provide twice-yearly academic reports that highlight your child's strengths and areas of development.

As we reflect on the past few months, and eagerly anticipate the year to come, we are grateful for your support in the opening of our new Free School. Calculator update: we have noticed that the academy preferred calculator 'Casio FX83GT X' is currently out of stock at many suppliers, and those that do supply are charging at an inflated price. We would therefore request that families purchase the calculator from school, through ParentPay once students have started back in September.

Uniform

As with all schools, the academy has a dress code that all students are expected to follow. We place an emphasis on being clean, tidy, and presentable. Our dress code is simple and practical.

The academy offers financial support to purchase the compulsory aspects of the uniform. We have issued families with a £100 voucher as part of your welcome pack.

Parent Pay

Dixons Newall Green will use ParentPay, which is an online payment system for schools. It allows parents to pay quickly and securely for school meals, trips and activities, uniform, equipment, and any other fees. You simply top-up your ParentPay

account online, by debit or credit card, or in cash through PayPoint stores. Your ParentPay balance can be used immediately to pay for any of your children's items at any school using ParentPay.

We will shortly be sending you a welcome letter with your account activation username and password. Once you receive these you will need to do the following:

- Visit www.parentpay.com
- Enter your Activation username and password in the Account Login section of the homepage. Please note, these are for one-time use only; you will choose your own username and password for future access during the activation process.
- Provide all the necessary information and choose your new username and password for your account registering your email address will enable us to send you receipts and reminders.
- Once activation is complete, you can go straight to items for payment, select which item(s) you want to add to your basket and proceed to complete your payment.

My Child at School

Bromcom is the market leader for cloud-based management information systems.

Bromcom has a parent portal called, **My Child at School (MCAS).** This portal allows you to log in and access details about your child within school. This includes their attendance, behaviour information and class reports. Bromcom also allows for faster communication between the academy and parents.

MCAS can be accessed via a web browser but is also an App that can be downloaded on to a smartphone.

We will be sending out further information about how to access this tool to families in September.

PDS (Personal Development Studies) / RSHE (Relationships, Health and Sex Education)

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) is delivered to all students during their PDS sessions throughout the academic year and are thematically linked to Relationships, Physical Health, and Mental Wellbeing. The Department of Education (DfE) outline the aim of RSHE is: "to give young people the information they need to help them develop healthy, nurturing relationships of all kinds, not just intimate relationships."

The RSHE sessions are delivered by advisors, SLT (Senior Leadership Team) or guest speakers. Assemblies also support the key RSHE themes and are delivered to whole year groups by advisors, a guest speaker or an SLT member. The curriculum is planned both vertically and horizontally with the end in mind and all resources are quality assured.

Our curriculum is planned to ensure that it is compliant with all aspects of the new DfE Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education and Health Education guidance.
