Drama

Our KS3 Drama stars have been lighting up the stage with creativity and energy! They've dived headfirst into the world of drama, exploring everything from the silent comedy of Charlie Chaplin through mime, to the art of storytelling and narration. Students have mastered the power of tableaux, experimented with thought-tracking, and even devised their very own performances from scratch. The buzz in the room has been electric, and it's been incredible to see their confidence, imagination, and teamwork shine. Drama isn't just a subject—it's where our students bring stories to life, one brilliant performance at a time!









Our Costume, Make-up, and SFX wizards have been busy turning imagination into reality! Students have been designing and crafting their own costumes—sometimes entirely out of newspaper! Bringing their creative visions to life. They've explored the magic of face paint, transforming ordinary faces into bold, colourful characters, and have even learned the secrets of SFX to create realistic cuts, bruises, and dramatic effects. It's been messy, magical, and absolutely brilliant, and the students have loved every moment of experimenting, creating, and seeing their ideas leap off the page and onto the stage!




Celebrating our curriculum

with knowledge

Geography

This term, Year 7 students have been focusing on developing their mastery of essential geographical skills. They began by exploring "Where do I live?" to build a sense of place and understand how geography connects to their everyday lives. Students have learned to use longitude and latitude to locate places accurately and have explored the continents, oceans, countries, and the role of Europe and the EU in the wider world. They have also developed key map skills, including using 4-figure and 6-figure grid references and understanding distance and scale. These activities help students read and interpret maps confidently—an important foundation for all future geographical study.





In Year 8, students have been exploring the fascinating topic of volcanoes and natural hazards. This unit helps them understand how powerful natural processes shape our planet and affect people's lives. Students have studied hazard risk and the plate tectonic theory, which explains why earthquakes and volcanoes occur where they do. Through case studies of Mount Vesuvius, Haiti, and New Zealand, they have compared how different countries prepare for and respond to volcanic events. Students have also learned about types of volcanoes, their impacts, and the importance of emergency planning. These lessons encourage them to think critically about how human and physical geography are interconnected. The unit concludes with extended writing and revision activities to consolidate their understanding and improve their analytical skills.

Year 9 students have been studying urbanisation, a key theme in understanding how our world is changing. They began by examining urban trends and the causes of city growth, including migration and natural increase. Using Lagos as a detailed case study, students explored the challenges faced by rapidly growing cities—such as overcrowding, housing shortages, and access to basic services—as well as the opportunities urban areas can provide. They also looked at urban planning and how sustainable solutions can improve life in cities. Through extended writing, feedback, and revision, students are developing the ability to explain complex issues, evaluate different perspectives, and think about how geography shapes the modern world.





Celebrating our curriculum through creativity

This half term, students across all year groups are diving into a rich and varied curriculum designed to stretch their thinking, spark creativity, and build confidence in reading, writing, and discussion.

- Year 7 are exploring Greek myths and legends, learning how stories shape cultures and values. They're developing narrative skills and experimenting with their own storytelling. As we approach the festive break, students will embark on exciting journeys into tempestuous waters, describing gigantic sea monsters, petty gods, and Odysseus' epic struggle for survival.
- Year 8 are engaging with social justice poetry, analysing how writers use language to challenge inequality and provoke thought. Through powerful verse and discussion, students are exploring themes of identity, fairness, and activism and crafting their own responses to the world around them.
- Year 9 are delving into Gothic literature, discovering how atmosphere, suspense, and symbolism create spine-tingling stories. From haunted houses to mysterious figures, they're learning how writers manipulate language to unsettle and intrigue — and experimenting with their own eerie tales.





Year 7 and 8 students recently attended a fabulous and hilarious performance of Shakespeare's The Tempest at The Shakespeare North Playhouse.
